RULES.

1.—That this Society be named "THE HAMPSHIRE FIELD CLUB AND ARCHEOLOGICAL SOCIETY," and that the object of the Club be the study of the Natural History and Antiquities of the County.

2.—That the Club consist of ordinary members and honorary members.

3.—That scientific men of distinction, non-resident in the County, may be proposed and elected as honorary members of the Club, at any meeting of the Committee, such honorary members not to exceed twenty-five in number.

4.—That ladies be eligible for election as members of the Club.

5.—That the annual subscription of ordinary members be seven shillings and sixpence, due in advance on the 1st January, and from new members on admission. That the names of persons newly elected be not entered on the list of members until their subscription has been paid.

6.—That the Financial Secretary be required to give notice to members in arrear, and that the Proceedings of the Club be not sent to any whose subscription shall remain unpaid. The name of any member in arrear for one year shall be removed from the list.

7.—That the Head-Quarters of the Club be at Southampton.

8.—That the government of the Club be vested in a Committee, to be elected annually, and to consist of the President, the Vice-Presidents, the Treasurer and Secretaries, *ex-officio*, and not less than six other members. The President and Vice-Presidents shall not hold office for more than two years consecutively.

9.—That three be a quorum of the Committee.

10.—That the Committee be empowered to appoint Local Secretaries for any part of the County, who shall be *ex-officio* members of the Committee.

11.—That persons who are members of any recognised Scientific Society, publishing proceedings, be eligible for admission as members of the Club without ballot, and that other persons, having been duly proposed and seconded by two members of the Club, may be elected to the Club by the ballot of the Committee.

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12.—That the proposer of any candidate be required to state the particular branch of Natural History or Antiquities in the study of which any candidate for admission into the Club is engaged, or is interested, or any other qualification, or special line of study.

13.—That in order for any such candidate to be elected a member of the Club, the ballot by the Committee be unanimous.

14.—That the Club hold not less than four ordinary field meetings in each year.

15.—That an annual meeting for general business be held in the early part of each year.

16.—That the financial report of the Club be brought up at the annual meeting in each year.

17.—That any member of a recognised Scientific Society, publishing proceedings, be eligible to attend any field meeting of the Club as a visitor, on the introduction of a member of the Club.

18.—That each member of the Club be at liberty to introduce one visitor (who may not be a member of any recognised Scientific Society) to each field meeting of the Club, but not the same visitor more than once in any one season.

19.—That members of the Club who do not attend any meeting, after they have given notice of their intention to attend, be liable for their share of any expenses which may be incurred by the Committee in connection with such meeting.

20.—That the Club discourage the practice of removing and rooting up rare plants from characteristic localities, and the extermination of rare birds, and also use its influence with landowners for their protection.

21.—That the Club use its influence to promote the preservation of objects of antiquity.

22.—That the number of members be limited to 250, but the Committee are empowered to include beyond that number persons of special attainments, or likely to promote the objects of the Club. Other candidates may be elected as vacancies occur.

REPORT FOR 1897.

Read at Winchester, 29th March, 1898.

In presenting their Report for 1897, the Committee have the painful duty of recording the death of their President, who was elected to that office a year ago, at the Annual Meeting held in this city March 30th, 1897. Mr. Benjamin Wyatt Greenfield, M.A., F.S.A., passed away on the 16th September last, at the age of 86. Few members of the Club were better known, and those who knew him best esteemed him the most highly. A frequent attendant at the meetings his interest in the Club was unabated even to the last. His great knowledge of Heraldry and Genealogy was of constant service to the members, and his store of learning was not more remarkable for its accuracy than the readiness and courtesy with which he was always willing to place it at the disposal of any who sought information.

During 1897 the Club held eight meetings, all of which were well attended and of great interest. With the exception of the Isle of Wight meeting the arrangements were made by the Hon. Organizing Secretary, Mr. T. W. Shore, F.G.S., and the members were glad to find that his removal to the neighbourhood of London had not affected his active interest in the Club, nor was the number or value of the meetings in any way diminished. Thanks are also due to the Local Secretaries and other friends in the localities where meetings were held for valuable assistance rendered.

The meetings were as follows:—May 6th, at Basingstoke and Old Basing; on May 13th, at Winchester, Easton and Martyn Worthy; on May 25th, at Hartley Wintney, Lateley, Eversley and Bramshill; Botanical meetings, June 3rd at Beaulieu Road and Brockenhurst; on June 15th, at Abbotstone, Bighton and Bentworth; on July 13th, at Whitchurch, Litchfield and Burghclere; on July 28th, at Mottistone, in the Isle of Wight; on Sept. 7th, at Selborne, Hartley Maudit, East Worldham and Binstead.

Special thanks are due to Sir Anthony Cope, Bart., for his kindness in hospitably receiving the members at the historic mansion of Bramshill. The house and its history were described by the noble owner, and its many treasures of rare interest were thrown open to the inspection of the members.

The Committee also desire to record their obligation to the Rev. W. G. Cazalet, of Bentworth, and also to the Rev. Canon Blunt of Burghclere, both of whom entertained the members at their Rectories.

It was not possible to arrange for an extra meeting outside the borders of the county. Indeed, owing to Easter falling somewhat late and the occurrence of the Jubilee festivities, it was found necessary to place some of the meetings more close together than was desirable.
