CHURCH GOODS OF THE CHURCHES WITHIN  
THE CITY OF WINCHESTER, A.D. 1552.

In the Proceedings Vol. VII., Part III., page 73, footnote 1, it was stated that separate Commissions were appointed for Winchester and Southampton. For the former city the Commissioners were the Bishop (John Ponet), the Mayor (Robert Beathell), John Kingsmill, Thomas White, and John Norton.

The inventory of Winchester Cathedral was published in *Archæologia* (xliii., 235-371). The transcription here given is taken from the MS. in the P.R.O. Aug. Office, Misc. Books, vol. 494. The goods enumerated in our present number are those which were left in the Cathedral after the Commissioners of Henry VIII. had previously denuded it at the dissolution. A list of the beautiful things taken away in 1539 will be found in *Dugdale Monast. Anglic. I.*, 202.

## TO THE KINGES MAJESTES MOST HONORABLE COUNCEILL

Yt may please your honorable Lordships to understande that we have receyved your letters the xvij of Octobre detyd the ix<sup>th</sup> of the same declaring your pleasures that wher as we in the later end of our former letters to your Lordships made mencon of certayne plate and ornamentes recovered which were before alienated we shoulde now signifye particularly unto your good Lordships what those ornamentes and plate were to what value and in whose handes it dothe remayne, for aunswer whereunto it may please you to be advertised that within the cite of Winchester wherof only we were ioyntly appoynted Commissioners, ther is no more plate or ornamentes cum to our handes but only one chalice with a paten of the same of silver and gilt weyng xviiij ounces and an half and fouer buttons of a sacrament clothe likewise of silver and gilt weyng one ounce and half a quarter which

remayneth in the handes of me John the busshopp of Winchester and this is all that wee have in our possession by force of that Commyssion which shalbe delyvered when, and wher your Lordships shall appoynte. No more unto your good Lordships at this tyme but that wee shall contynue in prayer for the preservation of your honors. From Wynchestrê the xxij of October 1552.

CHURCH GOODS OF THE CHURCHES IN THE  
TOWN OF SOUTHAMPTON, A.D. 1552.

The Commissioners appointed by the Crown to make the inventories of the Church Goods of the Southampton Churches were the Mayor. (Richard Butler), Sir William Barkley, Sir Francis Fleming, Thomas Welles and Thomas Pacy. Unfortunately there is but one inventory, viz., that of All Hallows or All Saints, in existence at the Record Office.

The Indenture made the xvj<sup>th</sup> daye of Julye in the syxthe yere of Edward the syxthe by the grace of God of Englonde Fraunce and Irelande Kinge defendor of the faythe and of the churche of Englonde and Irelande forsayde supreme hedd Bytwene Richard Buttler maior of the towne of Suthampton Thomas Welles thelder and Thomas Pacy esquiers commyssyoners apoynted by the kinges magestie for the vewe of the inventories of all churche goodes within the forsayde towne of thone partie and Jesper Keyer and John Emery churchwardens of the churche and paryshe of All Haloudes in the sayde towne of thother partie *Wytnessyth* that the foresayde churchwardens dooth knowledge them selves to have in there custodye saffe and shurelye to be kepte and att all tyme and tymes to be redelyvered over besydes one chales with a patent of sylver and parcell gylte one chales the fote and patente of copper gylte one cope of red velfet ij olde copes of blewe bawdekyn ij clothes of whyght-sylke for the comynyon table too abbes for serplyces too clothers of dyaper for the sayde comynyon table fower towelles and ij pawles to cover the ded bodyes reservyd for the use of the sayde paryshyners thes

parcelles followynge that ys to saye one chales with a patent sylver and gylte tenne unces one pyx sylver and gylte with a cover by estimacion twentye unces one hole sewet red velfett for a prest and too dekenis lackynge the cope one quyshen red velfett j quyshyon grene sarcenett too abbes thre auter clothes too coperus clothes and thre cases. Item in the tower one bell that the clock strykyth on and three belles more and one lityll bell to ringe to service every daye. Item more there was delivered of the vestementes and other ornamentes of the churche by the paryshyoners in the tyme of the warre to Thomas Rigge then maior of the sayd towne and to the aldermen of the same whiche was solde by them to the valewe of fyvetyen poundes<sup>1</sup> as by the particulores remaynyng with the sayde churchwardens apperethe to helpe the town at ther necessyte and defens for whiche the sayde churchwardens hathe ther obligacion under ther comen sealle to be repaydd att all tymes for the reparacions of their sayde churche. Also of late ther was delyvered by the sayde parshyoners to Richard Buttler now meyer and to the aldermen as myche plate of the sayde churche as the forsayde maior and aldermen solde for xvijtene li xvjs viiijs as by partyculers apperyth for sewte of the feeferme of the sayde towne for whiche money to the one parte of thes indentures remaynyng with the sayde churchwardens the sayde comyssyoners have putte ther seales to thother partye remaynyng with the sayd comyssyoners the sayde church wardens have putte ther seales the daye and yere above writen.
