

**WILLS PRESERVED IN THE PROBATE REGISTRY
AT WINCHESTER.**

HANTS WILL-ABSTRACTS TAKEN FROM THE SERIES
PRESERVED IN THE PROBATE REGISTRY AT WINCHESTER,
COMMENCING 1502.

By making a series of pilgrimages from Silchester to Winchester in pre-war days, an opportunity was found for making the abstracts which are here given. As will be inferred, the method employed was to record, specially, the dedications of churches as well as other ecclesiastical matter, such as Altars, Lights, Benefactions, and the names of Clergy. Where the status of the Will-makers seemed to give interest to their testamentary injunctions, the names of relations and other particulars were noted. Occasionally a curious phrase or word has been quoted. Many Wills which seemed to furnish nothing of interest have been passed over. No attempt is made to decide in which of the two Courts, Consistory or Archdeaconry, any particular Will may have been proved; the records of the two series seemed to be inseparably interwoven. The unvarying courtesy of the Officials in the Probate Registry must be gratefully acknowledged.

The most important apartment of the 18th century house was the staircase hall, which gave access to the main rooms of the house. It was here that guests were received.

Newel posts were still being reduced in size, and at Great Fulford (*temp.* William III) the designer was uncommonly bold, and omitted the newel post altogether, substituting, in its stead, a baluster similar to those on the flights.

"Ramps" now aided in the development of staircase design, and the handrail began above the lowest newel with a beautiful wreath, and swept from landing to landing in a simple and sympathetic line curving over each newel.

The balusters, too, are elegant and slender, and spiral twists, grooves, and small Classical columns followed one another as the expressions of their respective periods.

Cut strings, in place of the heavy solid string, appeared about 1710. The return ends of the steps were variously treated, and carved brackets, panels, and occasionally inlaid work, were used in their design. Mouldings, a little coarse in the earlier days, were now cut with strict regard to correct Classical proportions.

The staircase at No. 92, High Street, Southampton, is a representative and well-designed example of this period. It consists of two flights, framed together with cut strings, and steps with returned ends embellished with bracket carvings and inlaid work. The handrail is supported by balusters, two to each step, which are alternately spiral and Classical type members, beautifully cut, and with great refinement in detail, which is also true of the newels. The walls are panelled, and at salient points Classical type pilasters emphasise the landing levels. An interesting point about the newels and balusters is the entasis which is worked on each member with an exactness tending to diminish the appearance of weakness.

Many houses show great thought bestowed upon them in the planning and design of the staircase hall, and such examples, as South Stoneham House, convey the spirit of the century in which arts and crafts were foremost in the life of the people.

Right from the dawn of the Renaissance we see the work of many an unknown craftsman, both in the greater and lesser houses, at a time when the arts represented the great ideals to be aimed at—the ideals which are the making of a nation.
