garters apon and banderede ; a payer of vestimenties of
whyte with a redde crosse for the tyme of Lente ; one vesti-
mentē with a grene effectorie and lyons . . . ; one cope of
purple velvete ; [one suite] of vestimentes of whyete
dammaske with a cope of the same ; a olde whyte cope
with a crucifixe ; another olde redd cope with divers
