Rules as revised and approved at the Annual
Meeting, April 18th, 1921.

NAME AND OBJECTS.

Rule 1.—That this Society be named "The Hampshire Field Club and Archæological Society," and that the object of the Club be the Study of the Natural History and Antiquities of the County.

HEADQUARTERS.

Rule 2.—That the headquarters of the Club be at Winchester.

MEMBERS.

Rule 3.—That the Club consists of 300 ordinary members and honorary members in addition.

Rule 4.—That Scientific men of distinction, non-resident in the County, may be proposed and elected as honorary members of the Club at any meeting of the Council, such honorary members not to exceed 25 in number.

Rule 5.—That ladies be eligible for election as members and officers of the Club.

Rule 6.—That persons who are members of any recognized Scientific Society publishing proceedings be eligible for admission as members of the Club without ballot, and that other persons having been duly proposed and seconded by two members of the Club may be elected to the Club by the ballot of the Council.

Rule 7.—That the proposer of any candidate be required to state the particular branch of Natural History or Antiquities in the study of which any candidate for admission into the Club is engaged or is interested, or any other qualification, or special line of study.

Rule 8.—Any candidate proposed for membership shall be elected by ballot of the Council. Three black balls to exclude.

OFFICERS.

Rule 9.—That the Officers of the Club to be elected at the Annual Meeting shall consist of a President, 4 Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Editor, General Secretary, Chief Subject Secretary, and of the Local Secretaries to be elected by the Council. If at the Annual General Meeting the number of nominations for the posts of President, Vice-Presidents, Members of Council or any of the Hon. Officers of the Club exceed the vacancies, the election in each case shall be by ballot. Members cannot vote unless their subscriptions have been previously paid.

Rule 10.—The President and Vice-Presidents shall not hold office for more than two years consecutively.

HON. EDITOR.

Rule 11.—That the Editor shall, if possible, publish a volume of the proceedings in each year which shall contain the reports of the Subject Secretaries and an account of the Meetings and Excursions of the Club and the papers read at these Meetings.

Rule 12.—That the publications from other societies which are received in exchange for those of the Hants Field Club shall be regarded as the property of the Club.

Rule 13.—That all such publications received in exchange shall remain with the Editor of the Club for a period of 12 months, after which they shall be placed in a central library in Winchester accessible to members.

HON. GENERAL SECRETARY.

Rule 14.—The General Secretary shall be responsible for the non-financial business and correspondence, for the arrangements for the General and Council Meetings, and for the sending out of Notices of Excursions to every Member.

HON. TREASURER.

Rule 15.—The Treasurer shall be responsible for the collection of Subscriptions and the Annual Financial Report and Balance Sheet.

LOCAL SECRETARIES.

Rule 17.—That Local Secretaries shall be appointed by the Council for any part of the County that seems to them desirable. They shall watch the interests of the Club in their respective districts, investigate any matters to which their attention shall be called by any member of the Club and report any matters of interest to the Hon. General Secretary.

SUBJECT SECRETARIES.

Rule 18.—That there shall be appointed by the Annual Meeting, Subject Secretaries to represent the following or other interests:—Archæology (including Field Archæology), Architecture, Botany, Entomology, Geology, Heraldry, Historic Records, Mycology, Numismatics, Ornithology, Paintings, Photographic Records and Engravings.

Rule 19.—That the names of such Subject Secretaries be printed in the proceedings and that their function shall be to foster an interest in their respective subjects, receive communications from other members and make an Annual Report of work done to the Chief Subject Secretary who shall report further to the Hon. Editor.

SUBSCRIPTIONS.

Rule 20.—That the Annual Subscription for ordinary Members be 10s. 6d., due in advance on the 1st January, and from new Members on admission, with an entrance fee of 5s. That the names of persons newly elected be not entered on the list of Members until their Subscriptions and Entrance Fees have been paid.

Rule 21.—That the Proceedings of the Club be sent to those members only whose Subscriptions are paid for the year for which such proceedings are issued, and whose names appear, or should appear, in the printed list of Members contained therein.

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The name of a Member whose Subscription for any year is in arrear at the end of June of the following year shall (subject to the discretion of the Council) be removed from the list.

COUNCIL.

Rule 22.—That the Government at the Club be vested in a Council to be elected at the Annual Meeting and to consist (ex-officio) of:—the Past Presidents, the Officers for the time being, and not less than six other Members.

Rule 23.—That five be a quorum of the Council.

Rule 24.—That a Council Meeting be called at the discretion of General Secretary or at the written request of not less than 5 Members of the Council.

ANNUAL MEETING.

Rule 25.—That an Annual Meeting for general purposes to be held in early part of each year, on a date to be decided by the Council at which the General Secretary shall submit his Report, and the Treasurer his Financial Report and Balance Sheet.

MEETINGS AND EXCURSIONS.

Rule 26.—That not less than six ordinary Excursions be held in each year.

Rule 27.—That a meeting of the Council be held a month before the Annual Meeting to receive suggestions for the Excursions, and to draw up a list to be submitted to the Members at the Annual Meeting.

Rule 28.—That the organization of the Excursions shall be in the hands of the Hon. General Secretary who will receive such financial grants for the expenses as the Council shall decide.

Rule 29.—That any Members of a recognized Scientific Society publishing proceedings, be eligible to attend an Excursion of the Club as a visitor, on the introduction of a Member of the Club.

Rule 30.—That each Member of the Club be at liberty to introduce one visitor (who need not be a member of any recognized Scientific Society) to each Excursion of the Club, but not the same visitor more than once in any one season. Any such visitor to pay 2s. 6d. as a minimum Subscription towards expenses.

Rule 31.—That Members of the Club who do not attend any meeting, after having given notice of their intention to attend, be liable for their share of the expenses which may be incurred by the Council in connection with such Meetings.

PRESERVATION OF NATURAL OBJECTS AND ANTIQUITIES.

Rule 32.—That the Club discourage the practice of removing and rooting up rare plants from their characteristic locality, and the extermination of rare birds, and also uses its influence with landowners for their protection.

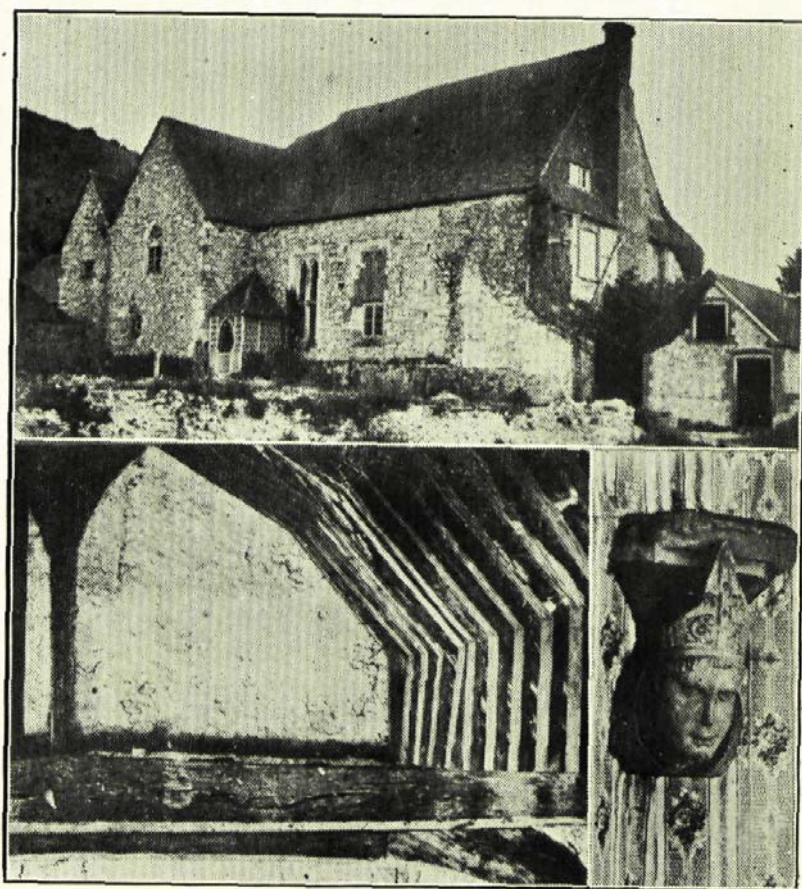
Rule 33.—That the Club uses its influence to promote the preservation of objects of antiquity.

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ALTERATION OF RULES.

Rule 34.—That no alteration or addition be made to the foregoing rules except at an Annual General Meeting; fourteen days notice having been given of the matters proposed.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE CLUB, 1923-24.

The 37th Annual Meeting, held at Winchester, on Monday, May 1st, 1922, was reported in our last, p. xvii.

EXCURSIONS, 1922.

The following excursions were held during the year 1922 :—

Strathfieldsaye, Thursday, May 4th.—Botanical.

Waverley and Farnham, Thursday, May 18th.—Directed by Dr. J. H. Gibson, J.P., and Mr. J. Alfred Eggar, President of the Farnham Field Club. Reported in the *Hampshire Chronicle*, May 20th.

Arreton and Godshill, Isle of Wight, Thursday, June 29th.—Directed by Mr. G. W. Colenutt, F.G.S., the Local Hon. Secretary. Godshill Church and the geology of the district were the principal features. Reported in Isle of Wight papers.

Butser and the Meon Country, Friday, July 28th.—Directed by Dr. Williams-Freeman, J.P. The principal objects of interest were the modern stone circle made (in 1861) at Bramdean by Colonel Greenwood; the Froxfield entrenchments; Butser Hill; and the Old Court House at East Meon. Reported in the *Hampshire Chronicle* and the *Hampshire Observer* (for August 5th). We wish to thank the Editor of the *Hampshire Observer* for kindly allowing the illustration opposite to be reproduced from a block lent by him.

Hurstbourne Park, Thursday, August 24th.—This meeting was held by kind invitation of the President, the Countess of Portsmouth, and was directed by Dr. Williams-Freeman and Mr. Dale. Visits were also paid to, and remarks made about Shepherd's Springs, Walworth, Tinker's Hill, the Devil's Dyke, St. Mary Bourne Church (by Mr. A. H. White), Egbury, Tufton, and Hurstbourne itself (by Mr. Dale). Reported in the *Hampshire Chronicle*, August 26th. In the same paper, September 9th, is a long letter from Mr. Arthur C. Bennett, criticizing some of the statements made at this meeting.

Melchet Court, Wednesday, September 6th.—Directed by Mr. Dale, and reported in the *Hampshire Chronicle* for September 9th.

Winchester District, Wednesday, October 11th.—Directed by Mr. R. W. Hooley, F.G.S., and mainly geological. Visits were paid to the gravel pits at Highbridge and Colden Common, in the latter of which pit palæolithic implements (now in the Winchester Museum) have been found. Reported in the *Hampshire Chronicle*, October 14th, 1922.

ANNUAL MEETING, 1923.

The 38th Annual Meeting was held at Winchester, on Wednesday, May 2nd. A full report appeared in the *Hampshire Observer*, May 5th. The Hon. Secretary, Mr. W. Dale, F.S.A., F.G.S., read the annual report, as follows:—

“ Since our last Annual Meeting, the Club has had the misfortune to lose by the hand of death one of its oldest and most valuable members, the Rev. Canon Vaughan. Associated with the Club almost from its very foundation, Canon Vaughan took an active part in its work, and particularly in those excursions which were of a botanical character. His large and practical knowledge of the science was always placed ungrudgingly at the disposal of the Society, and his services in this respect are a happy memory, leaving a blank which it will be difficult to fill. His literary and other work has been ably dealt with by the Winchester Press. It was the melancholy privilege of your Secretary to express in your name to Mrs. Vaughan our appreciation of the value of Canon Vaughan's work, and our deep sympathy with her in the irreparable loss she has sustained.

“ Mr. Ernest Westlake, F.G.S., was not a member of the Club at the time of his death in October last, but was one of those who assisted in its formation, and for a few months served as one of its joint Secretaries. Under a somewhat eccentric personality, he concealed a thorough and practical knowledge of geology, and was a familiar figure at the British Association and other gatherings.

“ In addition to the ordinary meetings of the Club during the past year, Southampton had the pleasure of entertaining the members of the Congress of the South-Eastern Union of Scientific Societies in June. The duties of President were ably filled by Colonel Sir Charles Close, and Mr. A. W. Oke acted as Hon. Local Secretary. Many excursions, archæological and scientific, were taken, at which members of the Club acted as conductors, and their services were duly acknowledged by the officers of the Union. Thanks are also due to Lord and Lady Swaythling, who, at Town Hill Park, gave a dinner-party to the leading members; and to Colonel Wilfrid Ashley, M.P., and Mrs. Ashley, who threw their mansion, at Broadlands, open for inspection and entertained the party to tea.”

EXCURSIONS, 1923.

The following excursions were held during 1923:—

Pylewell Park, Tuesday, May 8th.—Held by kind invitation of Mr. W. Ingham-Whitaker, J.P., D.L., and of botanical interest. Reported in the *Hampshire Observer*, May 12th.

Aldershot District, Wednesday, May 23rd.—Directed by Dr. Gibson. Included the Hog's Back; Puttenham; Compton; Loseley Court; at several of which places notes and papers were read. Reported in the *Hampshire Chronicle*, May 26th.

Stockbridge District, Wednesday, June 13th.—Directed by Dr. Williams-Freeman, Mr. Montague Edwards, and the Hon. Secretary. Visits were paid to Pittleworth, where some wall paintings, dated 1580, were recently discovered; King's Somborne; and Marsh Court. Reported in the *Hampshire Chronicle*, June 16th, and referred to in a letter from Mrs. Wilde, June 23rd.

Gatcombe, Chale, and Niton, Isle of Wight, Wednesday, July 4th.—Directed by Mr. G. W. Colenutt, F.G.S., Local Hon. Secretary. Included visits to Gatcombe Church, Sheat Manor House, Chale, Niton, and the Undercliff. Reported in Isle of Wight papers.

The Meon Country, Wednesday, August 15th.—Directed by Dr. Williams-Freeman and the Hon. Secretary. Included visits to Old Winchester Hill, Meon Stoke and Corhampton. Reported in the *Hampshire Chronicle*, August 18th.

Milford-on-Sea, Tuesday, October 16th.—This was the last meeting directed by Mr. Dale, before his resignation took effect. Reported in the *Hampshire Observer*, October 20th.

"Special thanks are tendered to our President, the Countess of Portsmouth, and to Sir Alfred and Lady Mond, who kindly provided tea.

"Owing to the efforts of Mr. R. W. Hooley, F.G.S., Hon. Local Secretary for Winchester, the Society's literature has now found a home at the Winchester Free Library, and is stored in a bookcase, which has been specially purchased for the purpose. Mr. F. W. C. Pepper, Librarian to the City of Winchester, has been elected Hon. Librarian to the Society, and has kindly accepted that office. The publications received in exchange from other societies are now accessible to members at any time. Included is a complete set of our own Proceedings, wanting only Vol. I, Part 3. Should any member be able to supply this missing part, the set would be complete.

"The Honorary Secretary regrets to say that failing health obliges him to retire from that office, and that to-day he asks only for temporary re-election until a successor can be found. After 37 years of incessant work, during which he has attended nearly all the meetings, and in many cases gone over the ground beforehand, he finds the duties of the office more than he can fill. At the same time he does not wish to inconvenience the members, and hopes to be able to carry through one or two meetings already partly planned for the early part of the session, but urges on the Council and the members to look out for someone at once who will assume the responsibilities attached to the office."

ANNUAL MEETING, 1924.

The 39th Annual Meeting was held at Winchester, on Thursday, April 3rd. Reports appeared in the *Hampshire Chronicle*, April 5th, and the *Hampshire Telegraph*, April 11th. The Hon. Secretary, Mr. W. Dale, F.S.A., F.G.S., read the annual report, as follows:—

"In reviewing the events of the past year, a foremost place has, unfortunately, to be given to recording the losses the Club has sustained by the hand of death. At our last Annual Meeting it was with regret that we had to record the absence of our Hon. Secretary for Winchester, Mr. R. W. Hooley, F.G.S., who had gone to London for the purpose of undergoing an operation. No one, however, expected that his illness would terminate fatally, as it did so soon after, depriving the world of a keen and practical scientist, and the Hampshire Field Club of one whom many counted as a friend, and all its members appreciated as a valued and able helper in its scientific activities. It is not necessary to enumerate here the many channels of service through which those activities ran. Mr. Hooley's life's work was so admirably described by the Winchester Press at the time of his death, that there is nothing to add. Perhaps the best standing memorial to him is found in the Winchester Museum, which was not only arranged and enriched by him, but was also interpreted and made interesting by his influence through the evening lectures which he organised in its rooms.

"At the opening meeting of the present Session of the Geological Society of London, which your Hon. Secretary attended, there were exhibited portions of the skeleton of a new species of *Iguanodon*, which Mr. Hooley discovered in the Isle of Wight, named, not after the discoverer, unfortunately, but '*Atherfieldensis*.' This has now found a home in the national collection. At the meeting in question, the President of the Society, with other distinguished scientists, spoke of the value of Mr. Hooley's work, and classed him with the famous men; who, though actively engaged in business, devoted their spare time to scientific research, and were able to enrich the world by their discoveries.

"This notice is aptly followed by an appreciative reference to the decease of Lieut.-Col. H. H. Godwin-Austen, F.R.S., a distinguished geologist, who, ever since the foundation of the Club, has been one of its honorary members, now reduced by his death to only three. As a geologist and explorer, his reputation was world-wide, and the second highest mountain in the world, in the Himalayas, was named after him. He was not able often to attend our meetings, but a few years ago he met us when we visited the western end of the Wealden area, and always took an interest in our doings. At the last meeting arranged

by Mr. Hooley in October, 1922, when 89 years of age, he wrote :
 ' So glad to see notice of geological excursion round Winchester.
 How I wish I could see the dear old county again ! I was first
 quartered there in 1859, and had gone to India in 1852, so you
 can see that there are no more excursions of that kind for me ;
 but I like to hear that they go on, and that your Society is keeping
 the interest going. I can still work in my studio at the Indian
 land shells, and draw and dissect and do work for the Natural
 History Museum. With kind regards.—Yours sincerely, H. H.
 Godwin-Austen.'

" We notice, lastly, with deep regret, the death of Mrs.
 Suckling, of Highwood, Romsey, a valuable member of our Club,
 and a contributor to our Proceedings. On the occasion of the
 centenary of Trafalgar, the Hants Field Club met at Highwood,
 by kind invitation of Capt. and Mrs. Suckling, when Mrs. Suckling
 read an able paper dealing with the family portraits and Nelson
 relics. On that occasion there was present Mr. Edgar Goble,
 of Fareham, whose father was on the *Victory* at Trafalgar as
 Secretary to Capt. Hardy."

Mr. Dale, to the great regret of all, resigned the office of
 Hon. Secretary, which he had held for so long ; and Sir Charles
 Close and Mr. Frank Warren were elected as Joint Honorary
 Secretaries to succeed him.
