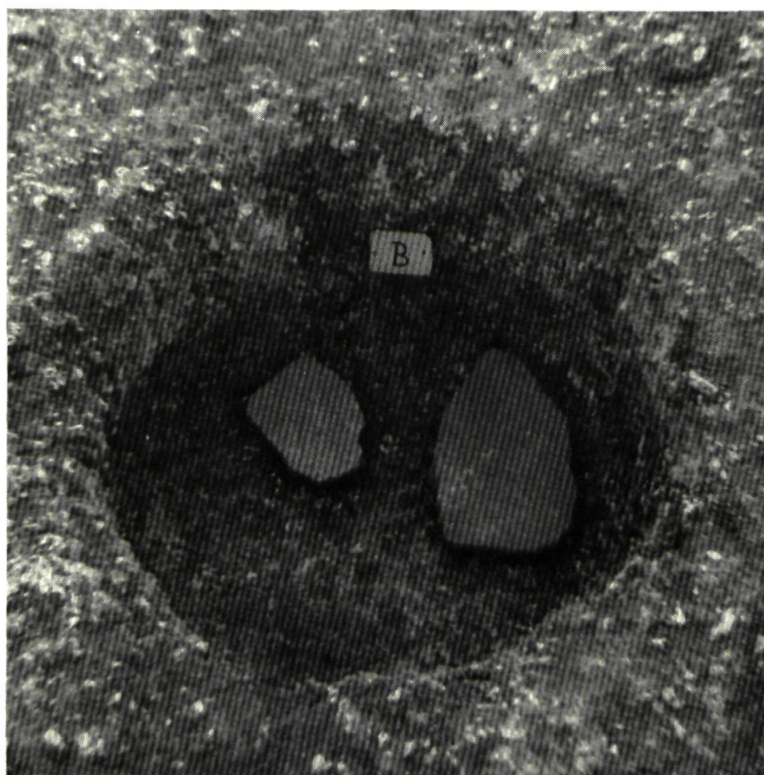

Winnall, Winchester, Hampshire: Middle Bronze Age finds:

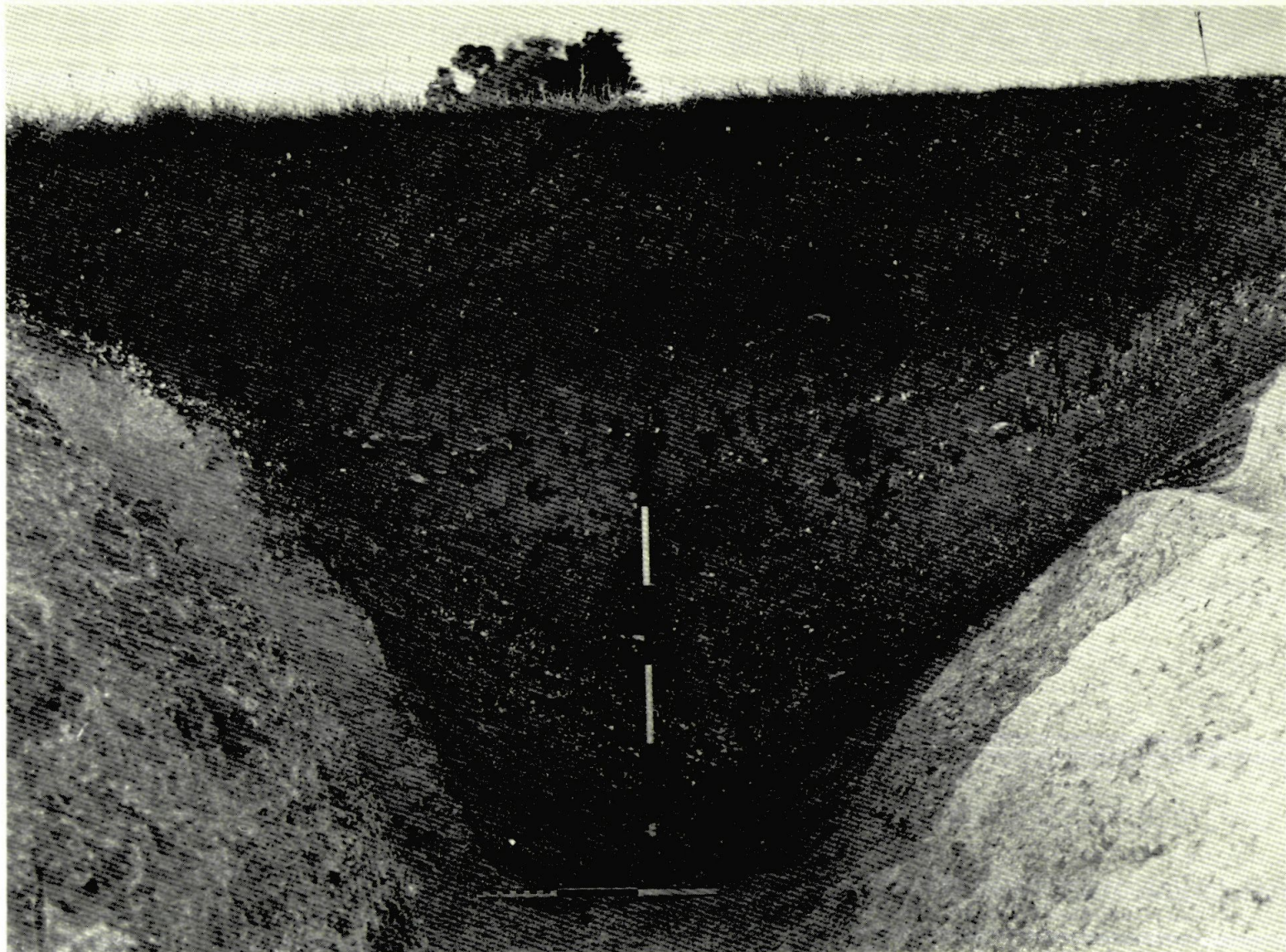
(a) Rim sherd of type 1 globular vessel, no. 1. Scale 1/2.

Balksbury Camp, Andover. Section of main ditch (p. 27).

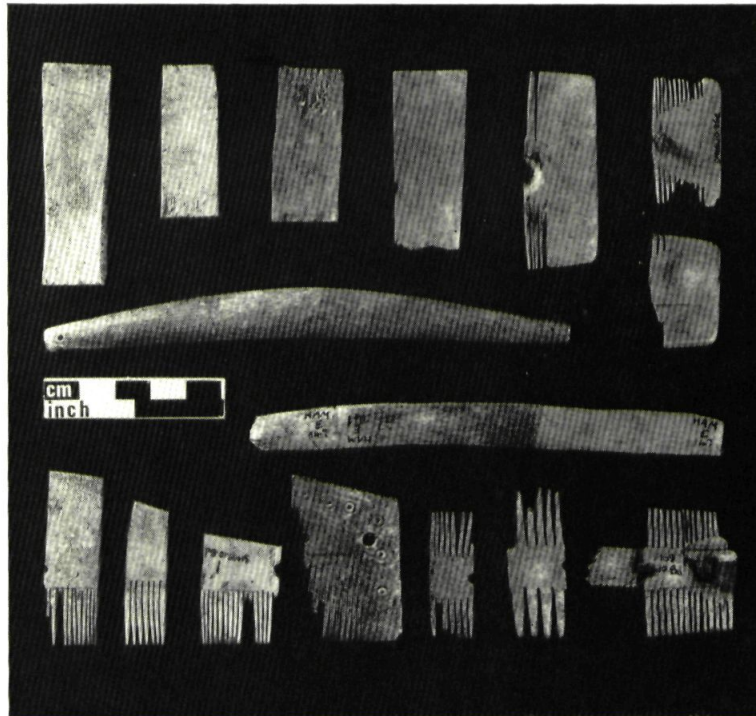


Romano-British cult object, frontal view (page 58).

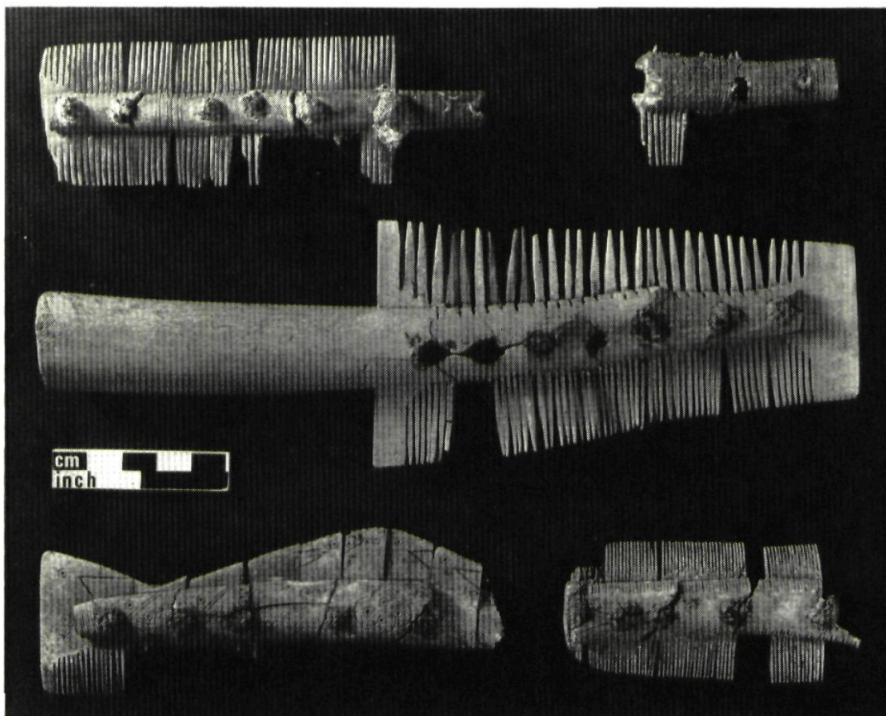
(a) Stages in bone comb manufacture (page 75). Top row, billets and end pieces; centre, rib and rib blank; bottom, finished single and double sided blade sections.

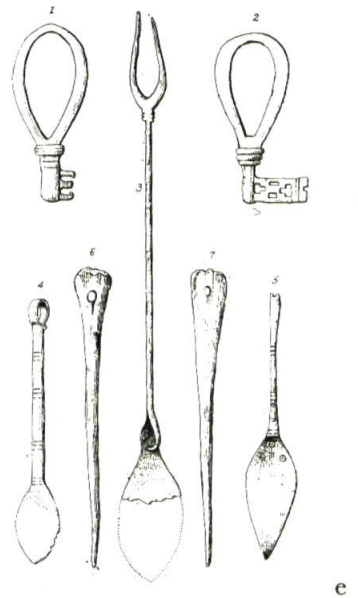
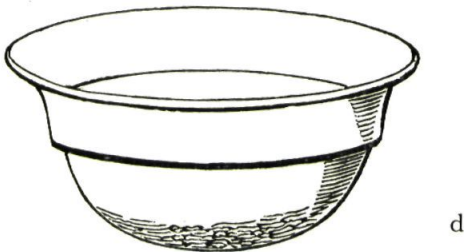

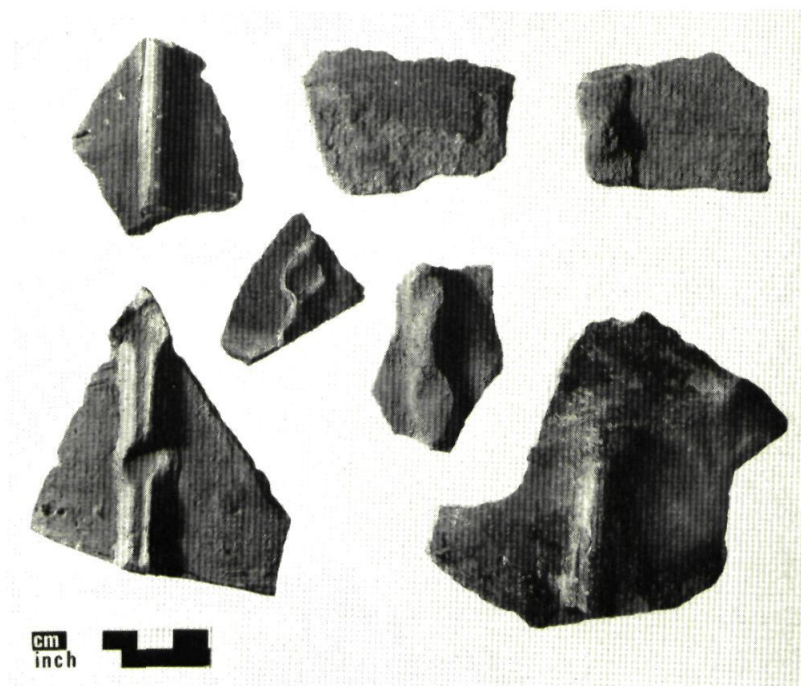

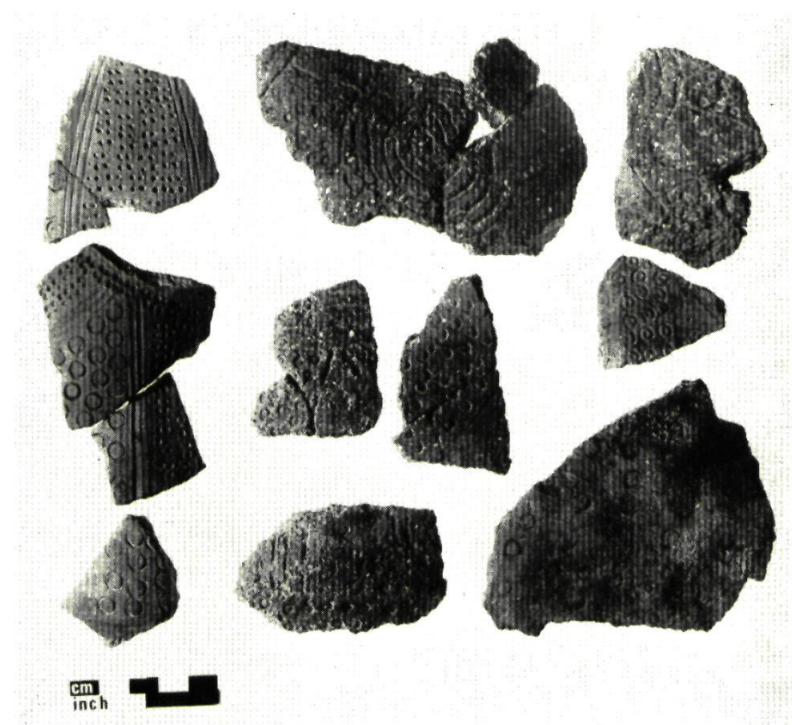

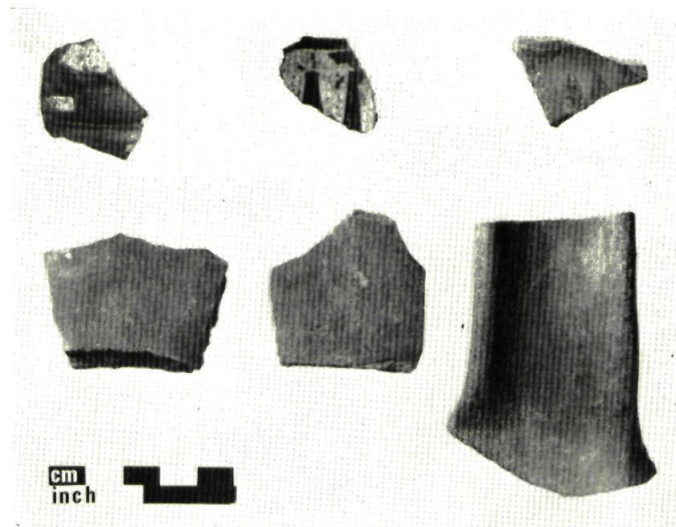
(a) Various wares with applied strip decoration, probably imported.



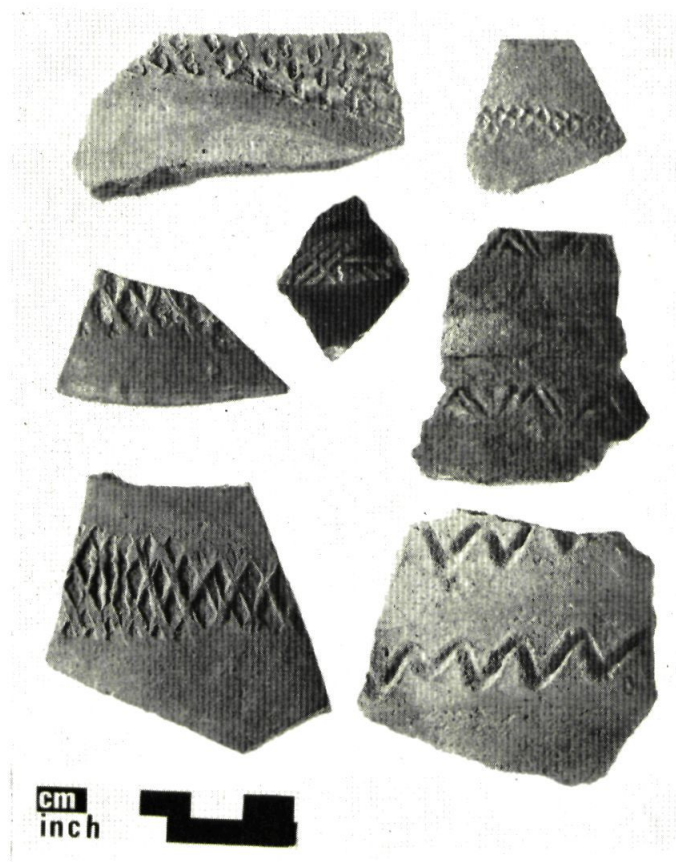
(b) Wares decorated with stamps and incised lines; imported (l.) and local copies (r.) (page 84).

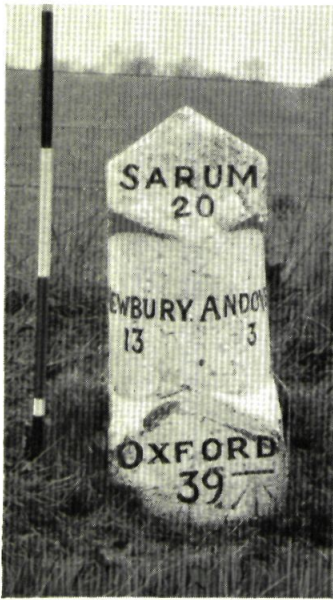
The light-coloured area is natural yellow sub-soil trowelled away from the burnt soil of the kiln. Note the ditch in the background appearing at this level under the kiln.

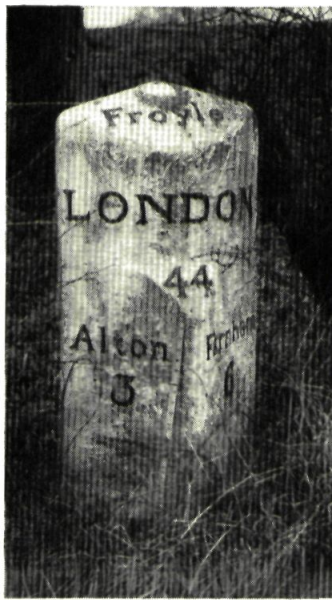

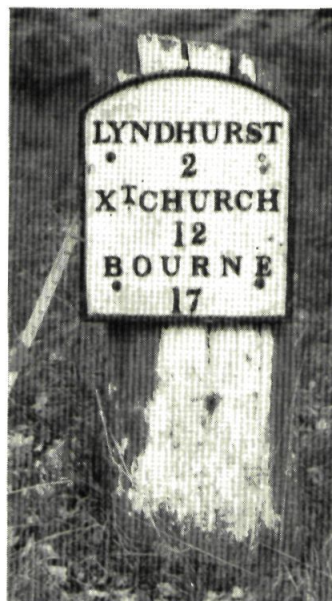

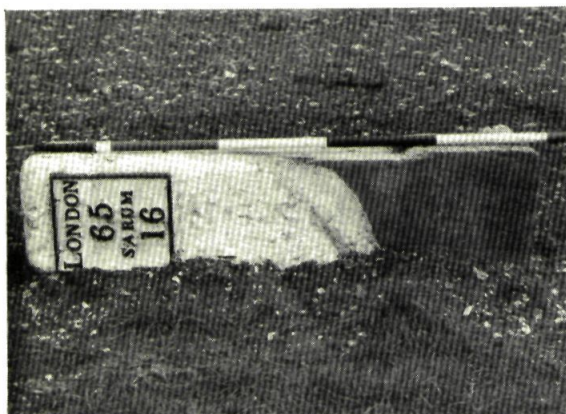

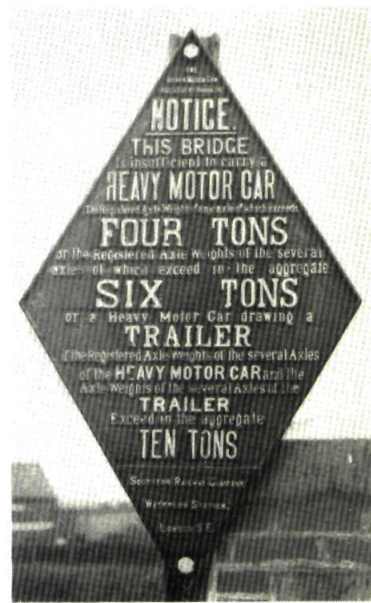

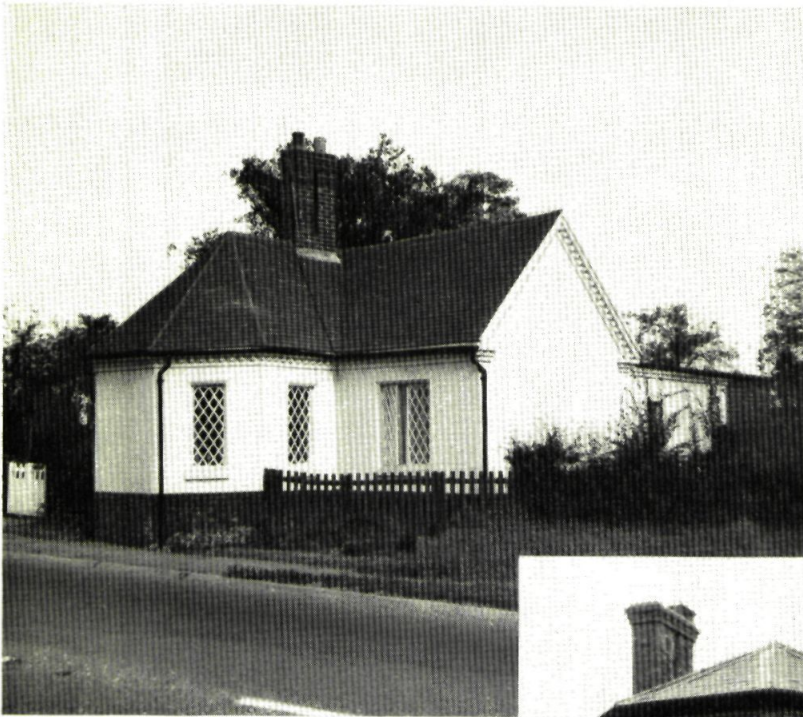
