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The Society was founded principally to forward the study and appreciation of geology, natural history, archaeology and history within the County and to encourage the preservation of buildings and other historic remains of importance. The Society is a registered charity – N° 243773.

The Society holds annually the O G S Crawford Memorial lecture and the Annual Conference. Many additional lectures and field trips are organised by the Sections which are based on the New Forest, geology, local history, archaeology and buildings. Members receive the Newsletter twice yearly and are entitled to purchase *Proceedings* at a preferential rate.

Annual subscriptions are £10.00 for ordinary members, £16.00 for joint members (two persons at the same address sharing publications), £7.00 for Junior/Student members and £16.00 for institutional members, who receive one copy of *Proceedings*. Application forms may be obtained from any Officer of the Society.
